

Dysart Waterworks Newsletter

June 2026

Water Customers:

The Saskatchewan Water Security Agency requires that once per year water works owners provide notifications to customers regarding the quality of water produced and supplied. Also required performance of the waterworks in submitting samples as required by the Minister's order.

A daily test of chlorine residual is done and the water supply, (364 chlorine test done in 2025). All tests met the requirements by Sask environment. A daily test is also done for turbidity in the water. Turbidity is the suspended solids, or the cloudiness of the water. Each test done in 2025 was within the parameters of the requirements.

A bacteriological sample is also required to be sent into the provincial Lab in Regina. We sent twenty-four (24) of the required twenty-four (24) samples in 2025, none of which had positive test results.

Chemical Health

All waterworks serving less than 5000 people are required to submit water samples to the Provincial Lab, for Saskatchewan Environment Chemical Health Category every two (2) years. The Chemical Health category includes analysis for arsenic, barium, boron, cadmium, chromium, fluoride, lead, selenium, nitrate, and uranium. The Village tested water samples on June 26th, 2025, and these sample results indicated the Village water was within the parameters. The last sample for General Chemical analysis was submitted June 26th, 2025. Sample results indicated that the provincial drinking water quality standards were not exceeded. The next test is scheduled for 2027.

The Councilor in charge of waterworks is Randy Christie. It is his duty to ensure that I as a waterworks operator am following the regulations of Sask Environment, such as daily bookkeeping, correct water sampling, keeping the waterworks tidy and clean, providing safe potable drinking water to our customers with minimal interruptions in service.

Brendan Liggett, our Environmental Projects Officer, inspected the north well, lagoon, and water treatment plant. The Village of Dysart is complying with the rules and guidelines of Saskatchewan Water Security Agency.
